### Christmas Salad

**Ingredients:** 1 package (3 ounces) lime gelatin, 1 cup boiling water, 1/3 cup Dole canned 100% pineapple juice, 1 cup crushed pineapple, drained.

**Cream Cheese Layer:** 1 teaspoon unflavored gelatin, 2 tablespoon cold water, 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened, 1/3 cup milk.

**Berry Layer:** 2 packages (3 ounces each) strawberry gelatin, 2 cups boiling water, 1 can (14 ounces) whole-berry cranberry sauce, whipped topping, optional.

#### Directions:

1. Dissolve lime gelatin in boiling water, stir in pineapple juice. Stir in pineapple. Pour into an 11-in x 7 in dish; refrigerate.
2. In a small saucepan, sprinkle unflavored gelatin over cold water; let stand for 1 minute. Heat over low heat, stirring until gelatin is completely dissolved. Transfer to a small bowl. Beat in cream cheese and milk until smooth; spread over lime layer; refrigerate until set.
3. Dissolve strawberry gelatin in boiling water; stir in cranberry sauce. Cool for 10 minutes. Carefully spoon over cream cheese layer. Refrigerate until set.
4. Cut into squares. Garnish with whipped topping if desired.

Yield: 10 servings.
